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2. One Additional Required 200-level Course (4 cr.) - Take one of the following courses to satisfy this requirement: LAS 211, "Latin American Humanities: [Topic]", or LAS 212, "Latin American Social Sciences: [Topic]." If take course other than LAS 211 or LAS 212 , will be a "SUB" (substitution). See website for approved "Substitutions."

3. One Required 400 -Level Course ( 4 cr .) - If take course other than LAS 407, will be a "SUB" (substitution).

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## 4. Two Required Hispanic Cultures through Literature SPAN Courses (8 cr.)

Take two of the following courses to satisfy this requirement: SPAN 342*, "Hispanic Cultures through Literature II," SPAN 343*, "Hispanic Cultures through Literature III," or SPAN 344, "Hispanic Cultures through Literature IV." If take course(s) other than SPAN 342, SPAN 343, or SPAN 344, will be a "SUB" (substitution).
See website for approved "Substitutions."
NOTE: SPAN 342 and SPAN 343 can satisfy the Pre-1800s requirement for the LAS major. If they are taken as required courses, they cannot also apply towards Elective total credits (below), though they may be used to satisfy the Pre-1800s requirement.

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## 5. Two Required Latin America History Courses (8 cr.)

Take two of the following courses to satisfy this requirement: HIST 380*, "Latin America," HIST 381*, "Latin America," or HIST 382, Latin America." If take course(s) other than HIST 380, HIST 381, or HIST 382, will be a "SUB" (substitution).
See website for approved "Substitutions."
NOTE: HIST 380 and HIST 381 can satisfy the Pre-1800s requirement for the LAS major. If they are taken as required courses, they cannot also apply towards Elective total credits (below), though they may be used to satisfy the Pre-1800s requirement.

## ELECTIVE COURSES (20 cr.)

Take four or more of the courses listed as approved Electives on the program website. If take course(s) other than those listed, will be a "SUB" (substitution). Keep in mind breadth requirements outlined below as well as upper-division course requirements.
Can outline additional electives taken beyond the 20 credits required if necessary to reach totals for overall major requirements.
Note: Upper-division language courses are not pre-approved as Electives for the LAS major. Upper-division language courses may be considered as substitutions on an exception basis for Elective credit for the LAS major if the student has already completed their language requirement. Global Connections Advisors are authorized to review, consider, and approve, when applicable, such substitution requests.

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## PRE-1800s LATIN AMERICA ELECTIVE COURSE (8 cr.)

A minimum of 8.00 credits must be earned through completion of a course or courses whose focus is on Pre-1800s Latin America. Take one of the following courses to satisfy this requirement: LAS 200*, HIST 380*, HIST 381*, HIST 480, HIST 482, SPAN 341, SPAN 342*, or SPAN 343*.
*NOTE: If any of these courses are taken as required courses, they cannot also apply towards Elective total credits, though they may be used to satisfy the Pre1800s Latin America requirement.

## LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

## As stated in the UO Catalog:

In addition to the minimum of 48 credits in required and elective courses, all majors are required to demonstrate a third-year level of proficiency in Spanish, Portuguese, or an Indigenous language from [the LAS] area of study. This will entail completing (with a grade of $C$ - or better or P) the basic two years of college-level language courses and taking at least four 300-level courses taught in the respective foreign language - such as Cultura y Lengua: Identidades Hispanas (SPAN 301), Cultura y lengua: expresiones artisticas (SPAN 303), Cultura y lengua: cambios sociales (SPAN 305), Hispanic Cultures through Literature III (SPAN 343), or Hispanic Cultures through Literature IV (SPAN 344).

- Limit on Multiple Department Credits: No more than 16 credits from any single department can count toward the major.
- Limit on LAS Credits Focused on United States Topics: No more than 16 credits in courses related to United States Latino studies or US Hispanic culture or society can count toward the major.
- Social Science Credits Required: 8 of the 48 credits must be from the Social Sciences, other than History and LAS (ANTH, EC, ENVS, ES, EURO, GEOG, GLBL, PS, SOC, WGS).
- Pre-1800s Credits Required: A minimum of 8.00 credits must be earned through completion of a course or courses whose focus is on Pre-1800s Latin America.
- Limit on Individualized Study Credits: 8 credits maximum may be independent study or internship credit

NOTES (regarding Overall Requirements):

Planner Guide for Advisors - select elements:

- "REQ" = "Required" - check off when course in Planner row is a "Required" course for that part of the degree requirement
- "SUB" = "Substitution" - check off when course in Planner row is an approved "Substitution" course for that part of the degree requirement
- NOTE: If both "REQ" and "SUB" checked off, that indicates that the "Substitution" is for a "Required" course.
- "INITIAL" = column for where initials of advisors or faculty director approving the course is placed (particularly important for substitutions).
- NOTE: "OCIAS" could be placed in this column if the course is on a term's Course List as an approved Elective or Required course.
- "DARS" = Check off if course is showing up as needed in student's Degree Guide. If it is not showing up as needed in student's Degree Guide, then an email to "DARS" is required, should be sent, and then the box can be checked off.
